Rules of Contest

1. THEME: Technology & Global Health

1.1 Objectives pursued

Organisation of a joint short video testimony competition on the topic "Technology & Global Health", the best 3 proposals will be showcased during the Annual Summit event organized in Szeged in June 2024 and used for official promotion of the Alliance.

To improve individual expression skills of the participants, promoting the importance of an intercultural community, widening the scope of intercultural communication, enhancing the importance and visibility of different ideas and concepts.

1.2 Expected results

2. PRIZES

During the pre-jury session, all submitted and valid testimonies will be evaluated by the jury, and the 3 best chosen speakers will be invited to Szeged, Hungary, to hold their presentation in front of the attendees, as the final round of the contest, which is part of the Annual Summit Programme.

3. DEADLINES & ADMISSIBILITY

To participate, contestants need to prepare a short video not longer than 3 minutes, of themselves addressing their own chosen topic in English within the context of the contest topic. The videos must be made accessible on YouTube. The video must be uploaded as unlisted so that it is not made for the public before the end of the competition. Participants must fill out an application form in which they upload their video and accepted the rules and GDPR of the contest.

Participants must only upload videos that represent their own intellectual property. In case the videos feature any persons, or data belonging to other persons, their preliminary consent is necessary. Each participant may apply for the contest with only one video.

By participating in the contest, each contestant is aware and accepts that EUGLOH and its nine partner universities can disseminate their work and reuse them for promotional purposes.

4. ELIGIBILITY

4.1 Eligibility criteria

Participants to the EUGLOH Talks have to apply to with the following eligibility criteria to participate:

- 1. Be a legal person over 18 years old.
- 2. No group submissions accepted, contestant must be an individual person.
- 3. Be a student at one of the nine EUGLOH partner universities at the time of the contest: (Ludwig-Maximilians-Universität München (LMU Munich), Lund University (LU), UiT The Arctic University of Norway (UiT), Universität Hamburg (UHH), Université Paris-Saclay (UPSaclay), University of Alcalá (UAH), University of Novi Sad (UNS), University of Porto (UPorto), University of Szeged (USZ).
- 4. Each participant may participate in the contest with one video only.

4.2 Exclusion criteria

Participants will be excluded if they (or one of them):

- are subject to an administrative sanction (i.e. exclusion)¹
- are in one of the following situations²:
 - publication of irrelevant, disrespectful or disturbing content
 - the participants do not correspond to the abovementioned eligibility criteria
 - bankrupt, being wound up, having their affairs administered by the courts, entered into an arrangement with creditors, suspended business activities or subject to any other similar proceedings or procedures under national law (including persons with unlimited liability for the participant's debts)

- See Articles 138(2) and 106(1), 107 of the Regulation (EU, Euratom) No 966/2012 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 25 October 2012 on the financial rules applicable to the general budget of the Union and repealing Council Regulation (EC, Euratom) No 1605/2002 (OJ L 218, 26.10.2012, p.1).
 - declared in breach of social security or tax obligations by a final judgment or decision (including persons with unlimited liability for the participant's debts)
 - found guilty of grave professional misconduct³ by a final judgment or decision (including persons having powers of representation, decision-making or control)
 - convicted of fraud, corruption, involvement in a criminal organisation, money laundering, terrorism-related crimes (including terrorism financing), child labour or human trafficking (including persons having powers of representation, decision-making or control)
 - shown significant deficiencies in complying with main obligations under a procurement contract, grant agreement or grant decision financed by the EU or Euratom budget (including persons having powers of representation, decisionmaking or control)
 - found guilty of irregularities within the meaning of Article 1(2) of Regulation No 2988/95 (including persons having powers of representation, decision-making or control)
 - have misrepresented information required for participating in the contest or fail to submit such information
 - were involved in the preparation of the prize documents and this entails a distortion of competition.

5. AWARD CRITERIA

The 3 finalists will be chosen by an unbiased jury consisting of members of the Alliance. The jury will be shown all eligible videos without mentioning the author's name or institution. Each jury member will rate the videos – without consulting with the other jury members - on a scale of 0-10 from each of the following aspects (total amount of acquirable points is 60):

- presentation skills
- relevance of the subject
- comprehensiveness/clear articulation of the message
- Impact
- innovative/unique approach
- convincing style

Professional misconduct includes: violation of ethical standards of the profession, wrongful conduct with impact on professional credibility, false declarations/misrepresentation of information, participation in a cartel or other agreement distorting competition

Once the rating is complete, the number of votes will be counted. Videos receiving the highest amount of points will be chosen as finalists and winners at the final round.

6. PROCEDURE, CHECKING ELIGIBILITY, DOCUMENTS

EUGLOH team will regularly check application forms and check the participant's personal details with their university of origin.

Contestants should note that they may be asked at a later stage for further documents (for legal entity validation, bank account validation, ethics review, declaration of honour on exclusion grounds, etc). In case the participants – for any reason - fail to present their data their works will not be eligible for jury voting. Any applications submitted after the application deadline will not eligible for jury voting.

7. OTHER CONDITIONS

- Participation in our EUGLOH Talks contest is voluntary and at your own responsibility.
- By submitting a video, you assure that **you are the owner of the material and that the video** does not violate any rights of third parties.
- Only those who are students at the 9 EUGLOH member Universities at the time of submission can win.
- In case of winning, you accept our privacy policy regarding the conduct of the EUGLOH Talks contest and the administration of your submitted video.
- In the case of winning, you grant EUGLOH permission stating your name if you so desire
 to publish your video free of charge, to reproduce it and to use and distribute it for EUGLOH's public relations work for an unlimited period of time. This permission also applies to the use of the material in exhibitions, printed works, electronic media, film and on the internet.
- By submitting the material, you assure that you have received a declaration of consent from clearly recognizable persons both for the recording as such and for the use of the material for participation in the EUGLOH Talks competition.
- If it turns out that
 - a) you are not the copyright holder of the video or
 - b) rights of third parties are violated

EUGLOH is not responsible to third parties, but you as submitter. EUGLOH is entitled to reclaim the prizes from the winners if it turns out afterwards that one of the cases (a), b), c)) mentioned above is given.

7.1 Payment arrangements

EUGLOH will reward the selected finalists via the EUGLOH WP5 campus life budget, provided all the requested documents have been submitted. Travelling and accommodation costs will be covered via the EUGLOH WP5 campus life budget of the finalists' university.

7.2 Publicity — Promoting the prize — Visibility of EU funding

EUGLOH may use, for its communication and publicising activities, information relating to the action, documents notably summaries for publication as well as any other material, such as pictures or audio-visual material that it receives from the participants (including in electronic form).

EUGLOH will publish the name of the winner(s), their university of origin, their prize—unless they have requested to waive this publication (because disclosure risks threatening its security and safety or harm its commercial interest).

Photos and videos taken by EUGLOH either in preparation or during the final round and award ceremony are the sole property of EUGLOH.

7.3 Processing of personal data

7.3.1 Processing of personal data by EUGLOH

Any personal data will be processed by EUGLOH in respect to the GDPR and data processing.

All participants consent that EUGLOH publishes the following information:

- first name
- last name
- institution
- department
- study level
- video submitted to the competition

in whatever form and medium.

7.3.2 Processing of personal data by the participants

The participants must process personal data in compliance with applicable EU and national

law on data protection (including authorisations or notification requirements, if any).

7.4 Ethics

The activities must be carried out in compliance with:

- (a) ethical principles and
- (b) applicable international, EU and national law.

7.5 Conflict of interests

The participants must take all measures to prevent any situation where the impartial and objective award is compromised for reasons involving economic interest, political or national affinity, family or emotional ties or any other shared interest ('conflict of interests').

They must inform EUGLOH without delay of any situation constituting or likely to lead to a conflict of interests and immediately take all the necessary steps to rectify this situation.

7.6 Liability for damages

EUGLOH or the member universities cannot be held liable for any damage caused to the participants or to third parties as a consequence of winning including for gross negligence.

EUGLOH or the member universities cannot be held liable for any damage caused by any of the participants in the context of winning the contest.

7.7 Checks, audits and investigation

EUGLOH Talks 2024 contest travelling award being funded by the European Commission, the Agency or the Commission, the European Anti-Fraud Office (OLAF) and the European Court of Auditors may carry out checks, audits and investigations in relation to the prize.

7.8 Withdrawal of the prize — Recovery of undue amounts

EUGLOH may withdraw the prize (travelling) after its award and recover all payments made, if

it finds out that:

- (a) false information, fraud or corruption was used to obtain it
- (b) a winner was not eligible or should have been excluded
- (c) a winner is in serious breach of its obligations under these Rules of Contest.

7.9 Administrative sanctions

If a participant has committed irregularities or fraud or has made false declarations, the European Commission may also:

(d) exclude the participant from all future contracts, grants and contests financed from the EU or Euratom budget for a maximum of five years (or 10 years in case of repetition) and/or

7.10 Cancellation of the contest

EUGLOH may cancel the contest or decide not to award the prize — without any obligation to compensate participants —, if:

- (e) no applications are received
- (f) the winner is not eligible or must be excluded or
- (g) the objective of the contest has already been achieved.

7.11 Complaints

Complaints against decisions negatively affecting the rights of a participant or winner can be brought before the General Court — or, on appeal, the Court of Justice of the European Union — under Article 263 of the Treaty on the Functioning of the EU (TFEU).
